John is a Principal at Rowell Brokaw Architects in Eugene, and is leading the design team for the EWEB Riverfront Master Plan. He has extensive experience working with public, non-profit, commercial and private clients on a wide range of project types.

With 20 years experience, John is a skilled designer and effective leader in the design process, and has received numerous awards for design quality, including the national 2006 Places Planning Award. He is an Associate Professor in the Department of Architecture at the University of Oregon where he teaches design studio and building technology.

John is a licensed architect in Oregon, California, Nevada and Washington and has worked in architecture firms in England, Canada and the United States on projects ranging from large-scale institutional and commercial developments to multi-unit and single family residential. His recent planning work includes the Chambers Neighborhood in Eugene, campus planning at the University of Oregon and Mount Angel Abbey, and mixed use developments in Florence, Grants Pass, and at Crescent Village in Eugene.

John received a Bachelor of Science from the University of British Columbia and a Master of Architecture at University of Oregon.
